Visit the Philip J. Currie Dinosaur Museum



Prepare Dinosaur Fossils.

Itinerary:

Friday July 9 to Monday July 12, 2027
Divide into 4 teams (maximum 7 people per team). Each team participates in each of the day-long activities over the 4 days of the tour:

1. Guided tours of the Philip J. Currie Dinosaur Museum galleries and back rooms. Use microscopes to find microfossils such as teeth from dinosaurs, fish and reptiles. Prepare dinosaur fossils. Free time to explore the museum on your own.
 2. Excavate dinosaur fossils in the Pipestone Creek Bone Bed under the supervision of the Philip J. Currie Dinosaur Museum.
 3. Raft down the Wapiti River.
 4. See the dinosaur footprints and look for fossils at Red Willow Falls.
- Overnight in Grande Prairie, Alberta each night of the tour and the night before.
 - Group dinners every evening.

Dinotour 2027 involves hiking over steep rugged terrain with elevation gains up to 60 metres (200 feet), lengths up to 5 km (3 miles) and durations up to 5 hours.

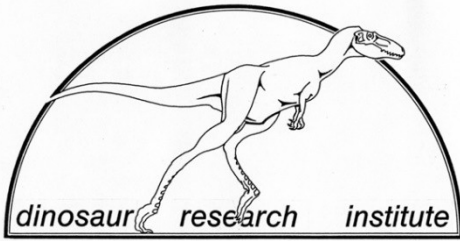

Dinotour 2027, July 9-12, 2027

Dinotour is a unique opportunity to discover Grande Prairie's palaeontological treasures with world-renowned scientists Dr. Philip Currie, Dr. Eva Koppelhus, Dr. Corwin Sullivan and coordinator Mona Trick.

During this four-day family-oriented event you will:

- Learn about the dinosaurs of the Grande Prairie region.
- Tour the Philip J. Currie Dinosaur Museum galleries and backrooms. Using microscopes, search for small fossils (teeth, vertebrae, fish scales) from the sediments of the Grande Prairie area. Prepare dinosaur fossils.
- Excavate fossils from the Pipestone Creek Bonebed under the expert guidance of the Philip J. Currie Dinosaur Museum.
- Raft down the Wapiti River.
- See the dinosaur footprints and look for fossils at Red Willow Falls.

Dr. Philip Currie is a Professor and former Canada Research Chair at the University of Alberta in the Department of Biological Sciences and the former Curator of Dinosaurs at the Royal Tyrrell Museum of Palaeontology.

Dr. Eva Koppelhus is an Associate Lecturer at the University of Alberta in the Department of Biological Sciences, teaching palaeobotany and the evolution of plants. She is also curator of the University's Palaeobotany and Palynology collections.

Dr. Corwin Sullivan is a Professor at the University of Alberta in the Department of Biological Sciences. He holds the Philip J.

Currie Professorship in Vertebrate Palaeontology. Dr. Sullivan leads the current palaeontological research program in the Grande Prairie area, together with a team of Canadian and international collaborators.

Mona Trick is the coordinator for this tour and amateur palaeontologist and volunteer. She co-wrote the book "Common Vertebrate Fossils from the Cretaceous of Alberta".

Dinotour 2027 includes:

- Guided tour including bus transportation to and from Grande Prairie, Alberta
- Five nights accommodation (double occupancy)
- All meals for each of the four days
- Admission to the Philip J. Currie Dinosaur Museum and for all of the activities at the museum
- Guidebook and goodie bag
- Canadian charitable tax donation receipt for a portion of the fees
